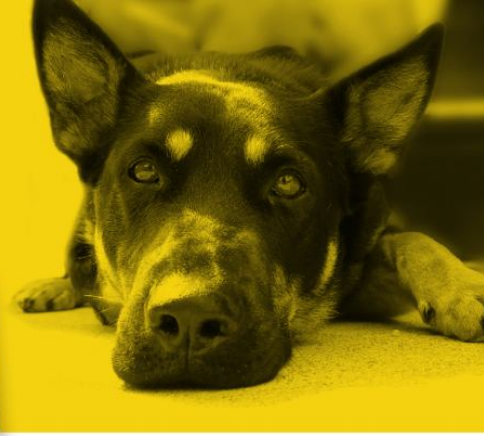

Dogs Trust Hope Project

The Dogs Trust Hope Project is a unique scheme that provides free and subsidised veterinary treatment to dogs whose owners are homeless or in housing crisis. At present the Hope Project runs in 100 towns and cities across the UK.

The Hope Project Veterinary Scheme allows homeless dog owners to apply for a veterinary entitlement card through any of the 270 homelessness organisations who participate in our scheme.

Dog owners can also apply to the scheme direct by providing us with written proof from a homelessness organisation or their local authority that they are of 'No Fixed Abode'.

The scheme is open to any dog owner who is:

- ✓ Rough sleeping
- ✓ Living in a hostel, nightshelter or temporary accommodation
- ✓ Living on an unauthorised travellers site
- ✓ Sofa Surfing
- ✓ Squatting

A veterinary entitlement card can be presented at any participating veterinary surgery to receive free vaccinations, microchipping, neutering, flea and worming treatments.

Dogs Trust will also subsidise most other necessary treatments that the dog may need up to the value of £400. The owner of the dog is responsible for the first £5 towards each additional treatment.

Please note that all dogs joining the Dogs Trust Hope Project must be neutered, microchipped and registered to their owner within 4 months of joining the scheme in order to continue receiving help from us.
